Introduction

This college was established in 1969 as a private educational institution. On July 1, 1974, when the sacred remains of the national hero, Shaheed Udham Singh, were brought to this city through the efforts of the Punjab Government, the institution was dedicated in his name and was taken over by the government. Currently, the institution offers Arts, Commerce, Science (Medical and Non-Medical), and Self-Financed courses such as BCA, PGDCA, M.Sc. (IT), M.Sc. (IT) Lateral Entry, B.Com, Post Graduate Diploma in Dress Designing and Tailoring, and M.A. (History), M.A. (Punjabi), M.Com, as well as Add-On Courses in Spoken English.

Admissions and Results

During this session, a total of 3602 students (both boys and girls) were admitted to the college. In the final-year examinations, a total of 1062 students appeared. I wish them all a bright future and extend my congratulations.

Scholarships and Student Assistance

Scholarship schemes are actively provided, including awards in memory of late educators and sponsors to support students excelling in examinations. Former principal Dr. Sudip Bhangu sponsors the Kulwant Singh Memorial Award for top-performing students, while Dr. Kawaljeet Kaur Brar provides annual tuition fees for one student in memory of her father.

Library

The college has different departments and one main library, which has approximately 35,000 books, journals, and magazines, supported by a digital management system (KOHA). Facilities like reading rooms, internet access, and e-journals are also provided for students.

Old Students Association

The association continues to contribute significantly to the development of the college infrastructure and activities.

Development Projects

The college has received funding of $\gtrless 2$ crore, out of which $\gtrless 1$ crore has been utilized for infrastructure development, including new classrooms, renovation projects, and the procurement of essential equipment.
