About the Institute

S.U.S. Govt. College is affiliated to Punjabi University, Patiala and situated in Sunam subdivision of Distt. Sangrur in the Malwa belt of Punjab, the college is serving the students of this area. The foundation stone of the college was laid by Honorable Sardar Gurnam Singh, the then Chief Minister of Punjab on 31stjuly, 1969. The foundation day has a great significance as it was martyrdom day of the worthy son of India, Shaheed Sardar Udham Singh who was born at Sunam. Hence, the college is named after Sardar Udham Singh. Mortal remains of Shaheed **Udham Singh** were brought in 1974 under the worthy leadership of the Chief Minister& former President of India, Giyani Zail Singh who showered his blessings by declaring the college being taken over by the Punjab Government. The college started with strength of few students with limited course which has grown today to 3269 students. 10 Programs 05 UG & 05 PG Regular & HEIS courses, PG Diploma in Computer Application, PG diploma in Dress designing & Tailoring, Diploma in Computer hardware and networking are running in institution. Three skill based Certificate programs under finishing school and four certificate courses under Jagat Guru Nanak Dev Open University are running in college. Many add-on/certificate courses were also run in the session 2021-22 for the welfare of the students. MA Punjabi as new course was started in session 2018-19 and M.Com started during the session 2022-23. Second Unit of B.Com (Regular Course) was also started from session 2019-20. Total No. of seats increased in B.Sc. by 20 seats each in Med/Non Med. from session 2017-18. The college library is housed with more than 30,000 books. Library is partially automated with software **Koha**.

Methodology:

The meeting of Academic and Administrative Audit (AAA) committee was fixed on 13.04.2023. The AAA committee was assisted by the IQAC members for conducting the audit. The Committee had a formal meeting with the Principal, Coordinator IQAC, Head of Departments and the faculty members, during which the Principal presented the overview of the institute, developments and the achievements made. Members of the Committee were briefed about the objective of the audit and the procedure involved.

The members visited the departments, along with the infrastructural facilities in the department such as classrooms, laboratories and the like, and interacted with the teaching staff and non technical staff to know about the academic and administrative performance. All the related documents were presented to the members.

Also, the members visited the central facilities such as Examination section, Computer labs, placement cell, library and auditorium, and had interactions with the coordinators. Other general facilities were also verified. The committee inspected and reviewed the documentation and checked whether they are maintained as per the Government norms and rules.

The Committee, after completing all stages of inspection and interactions, prepared the AAA report for the college covering the summarized observations and recommendations.

Observations:

- Internet facility is limited to college faculty and office staff only
- There is shortage of regular faculty as most of the faculty members are employed by college Parents Teacher Association(PTA)
- College Library should provide remote access to the resources so that college students can access library resources at their convenience.
- The college is having a good feedback mechanism which covers internal and external stakeholders
- In the category of innovative and Best Practices, the college is engaging pass outs and senior students of the college in the teaching-learning process.
- College is having adequate sports infrastructure which includes an indoor Swimming pool and hockey Astroturf which is available for general public as well.
- There are notable achievements of college students in youth and cultural spheres, particularly in zonal and inter zonal youth and folk festival organized by the affiliating university.
- The college is providing a very conducive environment for teaching learning process.

Recommendations:

- The college faculty members may be encouraged to apply for minor and major research projects of UGC and other funding agencies. Faculties should be encouraged to publish research papers, book reviews and articles in leading UGC recognized Journals.
- The college has started some remedial classes for academically challenged students, efforts should be made to make these classes more successful and meaningful..
- All Library resources should be available to students and remote access of resources must be the top priority of the college.
- The facility of e-content provided by the college to the students on the college website is still in the initial stage, focusing on upgrading it, many teachers can be encouraged to upload study material on e-content.
- The college must enhance ICT infrastructure by having sufficient numbers of computers, interactive boards and smart class rooms. Faculties may be encouraged to use ICT facilities during classroom interaction. Wi-Fi internet facility needs to be extended to the all UG and PG Students of the college.

- The institution should repair the building of Post Graduate Department of history on priority basis.
- The institution may adopt green and social auditing.
- College should participate in NIRF Ranking framework.
- It is expected that the implementation of the aforementioned recommendations would bring quality changes in all spheres.
